The agenda and focus of this event was pre-decided and it had three major components - Design Confluence for a design dialogue in the form of solo presentations, panel discussions etc; exhibition - Showcase for display and demonstration of new & latest products and technologies related to architecture products & building materials and Student Workshops for the benefit of students of Architecture and Interior Design.

This was followed by the inauguration of Design Confluence at the worthy hands of **Thiru R N Ravi**, Hon'ble Governor of Tamil Nadu. The inaugural ceremony started with the National Anthem, followed by Thamizh Thaai Vaazhthu. This was followed by lighting of Kuthu Vilakku (lamp) by Hon'ble Governor. He was joined by IIID National President - **Ar. Jabeen Zacharias**; Key Note Speaker - **Padma Shri Ar. C N Raghavendran**; Founder Chairman of IIID CRC - **Prof. D S Ramakrishna Rao**; Chairperson of IIID CRC - **ID. Ravi Meenakshisundaram**; Convenor of IDCS-Chennai - **Ar. Kunnakudi Srinivasan** and MD of AIM - **Mr. Kamal Khokhani.**

While delivering his Welcome Address, Prof. D S Ramakrishna Rao, expressed his overwhelming joy to see such a massive event, and he recalled how small IIID Chennai Regional Chapter (IIID CRC) was started in 1997 and congratulated the team on completion of 25 years of IIID CRC. He pointed out that IIID is the only platform where a dreamer and the person who converts the dreamer's dream into reality, can sit across the table and discuss. He asked the students to take advantage of the sessions, meet people and meet seniors who have done tremendous work and pick up something new for their future.



In his Opening Remarks, Ar. Kunnakudi Srini**vasan** quoted poet Mahakavi famous Tamil saying, "Enniya Vendum, Nallave Enna Vendum. Thinniya Nenjam Vendum, Thelindha Nal Arivu Vendum. Nanniya Urimai Vendum, Naam Adhai Peravum Vendum. Kannile Oliyum Vendum, Kanni Tamizhai Kaaka Vendum." He extended his warm and hearty welcome to the Governor of Tamil Nadu, dignitaries, and the audience. He highlighted the humble journey of the institution marking its 50 years with 33 chapters and cen-



tres with 10,000+ members. He further explained the glorious achievements and principles of the institution. He said that the very motto of the IDCS event was to generate collaboration between the fraternity and society. He further added that today, IIID as an organisation, stands tall in the Indian building industry with its multifold aspects under one single hat!

In his address, **ID. Ravi Meenakshisundaram**, remembered the massive journey of IIID and how it focuses on young talents. He recalled that the IIID CRC was started in the Image auditorium with a vision to concentrate on students first and then the young architects, because they are missing opportunities to network and learn things that are not taught in classroom. Hence CRC kept on conducting seminars and workshops. He congratulated the entire team at IIID CRC and AIM for the hard work they put in for the success of this event.



National President Ar. Jabeen Zacharias, while delivering her Presidential Address, expressed her delightful joy to see shape of the event. Recalling the formation of IIID, she remembers how a handful of professionals and traders assembled in a small village in Tandeli in 1972 to form the IIID. Since then, the traders and professional have been woring hand- in-hand. With 33 chapters and 10,000 members, IIID is celebrating its 50th year and growing strong, she highlighted. She added - "The most respectful design is equally complex in the



recent challenging times. So, we hold a lot of responsibilities. We think about spaces and create great values and virtues. Quoting Winston Churchill, she said, "We shape our buildings and thereafter they shape us." Hence, design is a tool for making a change for better tomorrow for people and planet. Design is an instrument for social change.

She further added how valuable the outcome of IDCS, where designers, professionals and trade will discuss, debate, ideate and flow together to a common destination, will be in enriching lives. She further added that Showcase is for the end-users to see and benefit. Good designs can touch lives, not for the rich and elite but for the poorest of poor and bring solutions to their lives and people. While concluding, she congratulated Mr. Kamal Khokhani of Akar InfoMedia for giving 'akar' to the event and wished the event all success. She also congratulated entire team at IIID CRC and AIM for putting up such an impressive and fabulous Show!

While delivering Key Note Address, Padma Shri Ar. C N Raghavendran pointed out the two phenomena that are crucial to the designing community. "What does the future expect from the design professionals, and how do we prepare ourselves for being future-ready"! By stating that India will soon be the largest economic power, he also stressed on equal opportunities for well-being and prosperity. Talking about the relevance of designs and its social and economic impact, Ar Raghavendran, emphasised that the power of design touches



the lives and welfare of people of all walks of life in an inclusive sense.

He further added that considering the fact citing that India is becoming a top economic power, comprehensive in all fronts, designers have to move away from the daily challenges of business growth and develop a global view, considering the aspirations of next generation.v

He highlighted that design can bring in vast social transformation of an enviable magnitude deeply touching the quality of life of millions. He also spoke about climate change as a threat to lives and welfare of people and planet. But he added, it has been created by human actions, greed and exploitation! Ar. Raghavendran emphasised that designers as the current custodians hold the key and we need to be attuned to the challenges in the role. Introspection and convergence are needed when humanity is in flux, and designers should rethink the value of what is important, focus on a new design thinking with a focus on resilient, regenerative and sustainable practices.

While concluding, he said that as designers, we have an important role to come up with design strategy for human survival, restore equality and justice for social impact. We need to address the under-served population, address human health, ageing population, climate and built environment and create climate resilient structures, connect back to land and social issues for fostering local engagement. Rather than client specific, designers should fulfil the aspiration of community for social impact and to improve the place and planet. He pointed out that practice of circular design thinking is needed to come from and return to nature. A new path forward is needed to mend the vision of materialistic relation with design and nature. For that, we can look back at our country where people lived close to nature and they never harmed nature. We need to take the essence and perform action to mend us for future.

This was followed by the launch of "A Handbook on Design Tips Towards Design Literacy for All" brought out by IIID, at the worthy hands of Hon'ble Governor, Thiru R N Ravi. The Governor said that when he released the Handbook, he felt so engrossed and absorbed by noticing so many things latent in the designers' minds and how it should be. He congratulated the team behind the production of the book as it is a very valuable addition, in creating mass awareness about interior designing.

This was followed by Inaugural Address by the Chief Guest of the function, Thiru R N Ravi, Hon'ble Governor of Tamil Nadu. "Transfer your ideas" was one focal points of his inaugural address. While elaborating, the Governor said that designing marks the phases of human evolution from primitive to what we are today. The urge of human being in the journey of evolution has been the journey from the gross to the subtle. Thousands of years back, people who created a habitat and now how the whole thing has changed over time. He said, it was the gross to the subtle journey and it is routed in the concept of evolution of our conscience that is our Indian concept. Giving a context to design, Governor said it is the evolution of consciousness which is so Indian and perhaps who expounded it most beautifully was Sri Aurobindo. Explaining how in the beginning there was only inner matter, he said, when conscious entered in some matter, life evolved. As it evolved, the complexity of life evolved becoming more complex- from Amoeba to human beings the difference is the level of consciousness, he exhorted. Quoting Rishi Aurobindo, he said that in the journey of consciousness some would move forward with their revolutionary individual consciousness. Similar to having thoughts on how to create more and more beautiful designs and people like designers will move to the higher level.

The Governor said that, we all know that we have entered a crucial phase of fourth quater of national journey - the 4th quarter century of our Independence. This is what we call Amrit Kaal, period of comprehensive rejuvenation of our nation. It owes different meaning to different people, but there that must be with active collaboration of all. While talking further, he said that "Our country is a fast developing and progressing economy. It is one of the fastest growing economies and has achieved incredible feat in various fields. We keep targets and we have been achieving it before time! There is a new Indian energy and confidence manifesting all around and when we complete the century we will be at the summit of world leadership. It is not because of physical matters of or military power but because of our Indian characteristic. That's the new India. Designs are not about just material prosperity. It has to add Indian characteristics."

But in the process, there is some recklessness and adverse impact on the environment and climate, which is a major crisis. Though we should not close our eyes to the good things in the Western civilisation, we should not close our eyes and mind to that of our ancient wisdom."

Quoting the Vedic mantra from Rig Veda, 'Aano bhadra krtavo yantu vishwatah' he high-lighted the tolerance of Sanatana Dharma and said that let all noble things, thoughts come to us from all directions.

He exhorted the gathering to take the western wisdom but to give it an Indian character. It is essentially that in our civilisation, humans not only worshiped the nature, but were living in harmony with the creation - that is our characteristic. This core element is unique to our civilisation this is what defines our character and with the power of dream we create things in a way in harmony with environment. "Designing is the base of civilization. Unlike western civilization, which is materialistic, we are unique and the thousands of years, old monuments and the intricacy of designs are living examples of it," he said.

While addressing the students, he said, "Getting adequate light, utility from limited space, and how to harmonize it with environmental awareness is what we should concentrate on. We are the catalysts, and we're the one who's pulling it up"!

While concluding, the Governor said that the world has started looking at India with expectation - expectation for solution, solutions for future problems. He said, "We will be showing the light to the rest of the world."

Towards the end, he also urged everyone in the confluence to visit places like Mahabalipuram, Thanjavur temple, etc. which are our places of pride of our rich legacy.

The Inaugural Ceremony concluded with Vote of Thanks. While offering the Vote of Thanks, Mr. Kamal Khokhani expressed his sincere gratitude to Tamil Nadu Governor Thiru R. N Ravi. "We are indeed thankful and obliged to you for the valuable time and it is a major milestone of our activity," said Mr. Khokhani. He extended a big thanks to team Chennai, sponsors, exhibitors and his own team at AIM for their unstinted support.

The materials alone don't work, but nature helps us with design experience. Design is over persisting and enjoyable." He then shared his recent projects and his exciting journey. He gave out some of his working strategies for successfully exe-

cuting projects during his presentation. He said, "The sunlight, wind, and air should play a major role, while designing. More than newer techniques, we believe in core values and subjects. Any design is possible only when you earn trust from the clients," he remarked. He further added, "When you are designing for a low-budget client, make sure you give them a sophisticated look in an affordable way. There is nothing called the latest designs. Whatever you do/approach is the latest design. Doing lots of business doesn't make you any different but making a difference makes you different."










Conference Day-2

Panel Discussion on Bringing Ideas to Life



The Day 2 of the confluence started with a panel discussion titled - Bringing Ideas to Life which witnessed participation by architects and designers working on different aspects.

This panel discussion was moderated by a Prof. D S Ramakrishna Rao and the panelist's were Mr. Michael Foley, Ar. P. Govindraman, Ar. Tejas Sidnal and Dr. Vinod Gupta. Prof. Rao addressed the gathering with his speech that quoted that when you give a piece of wood to a carpenter and tell them what you need, he has to bring that idea to life. It is where the whole conversion takes place!



With this observation, there was an interesting panel discussion amongst the panelists. Some of the points which were raised during the discussion were - What would be the singular thought/quality idea for a quality life? What is one good idea which can transform our lives? By the end of the panel discussion, everyone understood the practical application of sustainable design ideas and the importance of establishing balancing designs. The moderator Prof. Rao, ended by saying, "Let's look at several new ways to explore, let's look into a new, green, and clean India. These can be the best ideas to put into our lives."

Solo Presentation by Ar. Shabnam Gupta



While the panel discussion ended giving the audience food for thought, the confluence progresses to the second highlight of the show which was a solo presentation by Ar. Shabnam Gupta.

Ar. Shabnam Gupta, who is a well-known architect and interior designer, displayed some of her works, providing a glimpse into her spectacular journey in the amazing world of interior design. An interior designer by chance, Shabnam presented four homes and two hospitality spaces before the audience. While walking

the audience through her journey, she said that she and her team believe in finding the extraordinary in the ordinary and offer completely customised spaces. She said that she, along with her team of design enthusiasts, did some 'spirited work' to suit the persona of the client. While talking about her design philosophy, she said, "I often say that a powerful design aesthetic can only stem from the right work ethic, one that keeps people before design and function before form. As an interior designer, I understand the dynamics of design shared with people and hence the responsibility that comes with it." The projects she presented were simply amazing and electrifying - they kept the audience, mesmerised! The designs, settings, accessories and overall outcome of each project was awe-inspiring, especially for the young students. While addressing these upcoming designers of the future, she said - "I always want originality to flourish through my design and my intent is to create timeless stories that are exclusively and artistically endowed." While talking further, she added that, "Starting work without a solid pre-plan will never work out. So, proper on-ground work happens only with a well-designed pre-plan."







Panel Discussion on Dynamics of Sustainable Interiors

The solo presentation by Ar. Shabnam Gupta was followed by a panel discussion on Dynamics of Sustainable Interiors.



Ar. Suneet Paul moderated the panel discussion, which had Mr. Sandeep Sangaru, Ar. Shailesh Gajjar, Ar. B. Sudhir, Ar. Maetri Buch, and Ar. Neelam Manjunath as panelists. In his opening remarks, Ar. Paul observed that, "I would like to look at contemporary India positively. India is the fifth largest economy in the world, and designs play a significant role. Purpose ful experimentation is important for all of us." This lead to an interes ing discussion amongst the panelists on topics like sustainable practice, traditional methodology, affordability, durability, environmental context, reciprocating to proximate natural resources, wisdom of the past etc. The panel discussion's focal point was the recognition of crafts and craftsmanship. It was

also discussed how important it is to stick to the core design values and how we shouldn't hesitate to bring them back along with sustainable solutions. Another important aspect was the oath taken by the designers to add more 'R's, which are - Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Resistant, Refuse, and Repurposing.



Valedictory Function ___

The Valedictory Session began with the overall observation and assessment by the Convenor of IDCS, Ar. Kunnakudi Sreenivasan, which was followed by observations by the Chairman of IIID CRC - ID. Ravi Meenakshisundaram. This was followed by the Valedictry address by Ar. Sheila Sri Prakash.





In her valedictory address, Ar. Sheila Sri Prakash recalled how the times have changed and how there are major changes in the architectural practice the world over. Now is the time, she added, where everyone have has to think differently and collaboratively and think from everyone's perspective. While recalling when she started in 1979, they used to draw/design what they liked and convinced

the clients. "Now the client is first, everyone has a contribution. But designers should have a holistic story to say. It's a constant and anxious thing to convince a client. So, the biggest challenge is to retain the sanity and design thread" She further added, "Your intuitive judgment may not always be the best. Understand what it takes to design a space that's inspiring. How to integrate nature with our design? Designing is never a separate compartment from nature. One single person should majorly handle a design. The reciprocal architecture depends on what is available and getting a balance in the design. Creating a balance is important, and the designers' role is even more responsive to the stakeholders." While talking about the role of designers, she said, "Regarding aesthetics, our fashion designers have imbibed our own culture and craftsmen. So, we, as architects, should look out for our instincts and what makes us stand out from others. We have to restore our craftsmanship and restore their innovation."



This was followed by the presentation of awards for best stall designs. In the beginning, ID. Rashmi Yadav explained about the whole process about formation of jury, which consisted of around 30 renowned architects and interor designers from Chennai, and the assessment criteria. She also explained that awards were being announced in two categories - Small stalls (upto 18 sq mtr size) and Large stalls (more than 18 sq mtrs) and each

category will have three winners. Then after, Mr. Kamal Khokhani and ID. Ravi Meenakshisundaram announced the awards which are as under –

Student Workshops

As a part of the IDCS, with a view of engaging the students and grooming them for the future, the organizers had planned four workshops for the senior students of Architecture and Interior Design which were organised as concurrent events. As many as 500 students participated in these workshops and benefitted from the same. Here is the brief write up about each workshop -

(1) KOKEDAMA WORKSOP

Ms. Kalpana Yuvarraj was the Resource Person for this workshop where students were taught this 17th century Japanese art of Kokedama, which is to plant herbs and ferns in a ball of soil, whose surface is covered with moss, jute thread etc. These soil balls can be suspended at homes and offices.



(2) STEREOTOMY OF SOLID GEOMETRIES

This workshop, undertaken by Ar. Mohafiz Riyaz taught and explained the students about stereotomy - the art and science of cutting three-dimensional solids into particular shapes, be it uni-directional, bi-directional or multi-directional. It also touched the topic of waffling, based on bi-directional strategy that uses planer sections to build free-form objects. Besides, this workshop also touched on the usage of essential software like Rhino.



(3) SCULPT YOUR IDEAS

This workshop, mentored by Ar. Kaathu Saravana Raja, was curated to render hands-on modelling for the students, designers and professionals in the design stream. In this workshop the participants were taught to perceive a form and translating it into a 3D model. The technique of pins with thread connections to build the model was also explained and demonstrated.



(4) MAKING SEED PENCIL FROM WOODEN TWIG

Mr. Gopal Khatri was the Resource Person for this interesting workshop, wherein he demonstrated how to make a pencil from rustic wooden twig, which is recyclable. He explained, as to how one end of pencil is used for writing and the other end is customised to hold seeds and once the pencil is used completely, it can be planted which can help is growing more trees and saving the environment.




Exhibition Showcase






